New Trails

The summer of 1979 saw an active Parks Canada Trail Crew once again in Lake O'Hara Region. With guidance from Alan Knowles, a new trail was blazed from the Alpine meadow to Odaray Plateau. This new route is a great improvement over the old trail, which was badly eroded and often very wet. The trail crew also improved the route from Morning Glory Lakes to Linda Lake.

Vice President & Directors Chosen

At the 1979 Annual Meeting, Austin H. Ford of Calgary, former owner of Lake O'Hara Lodge was elected Vice President of the Trails Club by the board of directors. Eileen Desbrisay of Vancouver and Milton Fruchtman of Banff were elected as new members of the board of directors.

Membership

The total number of Life memberships in the Trails Club increased by 35% from 205 to 276 in 1979. With annual members the total membership in the Club at the close of 1979 was 302. This increase can be attributed largely to better public exposure to the club through the pamphlet published last year. The pamphlet has been reprinted and will be distributed again this year. It is anticipated that the Trails Club by the year 1981 will have a membership of 450.

Lillian Gest Honoured

As a gesture of appreciation for her work on the History of Lake O'Hara, the Trails Club presented Lillian Gest with a framed pencil sketch of the O'Hara region done by Dave Biederman of Jasper.

The Trail Ended for Some

As many of you learned last summer. Dr. George Link died in May in Tucson at the age of 91. His death marked the end of an era at Lake. O'Hara. His devotion and dedication in achieving the goal of creating a system of ways in this region will long be remembered. Along with Dr. Link, two other prominent Trails Club members, Harry Green and Sydney Vallance died last Spring. Harry Green came to Canada in 1912 and was associated with the legal department of the CPR. He was a president of the Alpine Club of Canada and a director of the Lake O'Hara Trails Club. Sydney Vallance was a past president of the Lake O'Hara Trails Club.

More recently, Banff area residents mourned the death of Lawrence Grassi, another trailblazer whose fine stonework enhances several of the routes in the O'Hara area.

Proposed Publication on Dr. Link

Jon Whyte of Banff has indicated an interest in writing a small booklet on Dr. Link's activities at Lake O'Hara. It is hoped that this project will be underway this summer and be ready for the 1981 season.

The Trails Club is in the process of purchasing a slide projector and screen in conjunction with Lake O'Hara Lodge.
